Project to Improve Perinatal Care in Sri Lanka by Capacity Building through a Sustainable, Benchmarked Training

Ministry of Health Care Nutrition and Indigenous Medicine, "Suwasiripaya", Colombo 10.

Background of the project; Results from National Maternal Mortality Review have shown that most of maternal deaths in Sri Lanka are still preventable. Post-partum Hemorrhage (PPH), severe preeclampsia and eclampsia, together with unsafe abortion continue to be leading causes of maternal mortality. This raises the hypothesis of a possible suboptimal quality of care at facility level, as 99.9% of deliveries occur in a hospital and 92% of them in specialist hospitals. Hence it is important to focus on improving quality of perinatal care.

Although Sri Lanka has skilled healthcare workforce, their knowledge is mostly limited to their basic training. We plan to build capacity of personnel providing maternity care by establishing modern, benchmarked, evidence based training course.

A group of trainers were trained by the Emergency Obstetric Care Course of the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine in March 2016. Now we are planning to train staff in maternity units from hospitals throughout the country on a regular basis.

- 2. Support in maintaining records, information and data related to the course
- 3. Liaise with the Family Health Bureau and other relevant organizations as per the need to organize and conduct courses
